#### **Rock Wall**

The mission of the Maeystown Preservation Society is to preserve the history, culture, customs, architecture and structure of the village of Maeystown. We are eager to announce our next major project will be to completely restore the rock walls on our lots on Hanover Street. David Grimes plans to begin the restoration in May or June, depending on the weather. This site contains approximately one thousand square feet of rock wall and four sets of stairs. He explains that the rock walls and steps are going to be restored as closely as possible to their original condition. Stones will be removed in order and marked to be rebuilt accordingly. Photographic aids and on-site measurements will also be used. No mortar or cement will be used anywhere in the restoration. The earth banks behind the walls will be excavated as needed to permit the required lean-in of the finished wall. Periodic visits to refill and regrade the ground behind the walls will be necessary as the fill settles. This could take up to a year. Again depending on the weather, Mr. Grimes estimates the main part of this project to take two months from start to finish. We are anxious to watch the work as it progresses.

### Maeystown Telephone Directory

Have you ever seen a telephone directory without telephone numbers? The Society now owns one. We were fortunate to purchase it at a local auction. It contains only seven pages and is approximately three and one fourth inches by six and a half inches. The cover identifies it as a "Telephone Directory" from the Maeystown Telephone Co. and printed by Waterloo Times Print. Since there were no telephone numbers at that time, it simply contains the names of people and businesses from Maeystown and Brownsburg who had telephone service. We are able to date it prior to 1903. At that time Brownsburg opened a post office. It was necessary to change the name of the village because of the similarity to Brownstown, Brownsville and other Illinois post offices. (The name was changed to Fults in honor of Jacob Fults who homesteaded land nearby.) The directory is interesting to read with 100 listings for Maeystown and 57 in Brownsburg. There are many familiar names and even a few misspelled like Schulz and Valentin. Some of the businesses include: Diehl Brothers, Maeys & Pape Station, Ivy Mercantile Company and Limestall & Bradshaw (General Store). We are anxious to add this to our museum. If you have information about where the Maeystown Telephone Company would have been located at that time or even who operated it, please contact us.
