Old Fashioned German Christmas 2015

The annual Old Fashioned German Christmas in Maeystown celebration will be held on Sunday, December 6, 2015 from 11:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. The event will focus on German customs and music. Sponsored by Historic Maeystown, there will be a strolling brass ensemble, a vocal ensemble from Valmeyer High School, hammered dulcimers, a traditional carol sing at the tree lighting and the German carol sing at the inn. There will be a demonstration of German paper stars and an opportunity for people to make Carved wooden photography, women's jackets and jewelry will be featured. The Women's Club will host A Taste of Christmas in the basement of the mill. The Women's Fellowship of St. John Church will hold their annual Christkindlmarkt in the church hall and also, for the first time, a quilt show in the sanctuary of St John Church. Carriage rides will be available in the afternoon and a photo opportunity with a traditional Victorian sled will be possible at the mill. There will be other activities, as well as the traditional German Weihnacht Stew and other great food at the village eateries. Also, a house tour of several Maeystown homes will be held from 12 noon - 4 p.m. Tickets for the house tour must be purchased at the General Store. Proceeds will benefit a local family.

More News from the "Republic Times" of Waterloo

The following article from the "Republic Times" is from the Ethan May donation reported in a previous Volksblatt.

Obituary March 2, 1917

Fred H. Hesterberg, of Maeystown died in St. Clements Hospital, Red Bud, Illinois, Sunday morning, February 25, 1917, aged 47 years, 8 months and 2 days.

Deceased had been sick only on short week and was removed to the hospital to undergo an operation. He was one of the prominent farmer near Maeystown and resided two miles east of that village. He leaves a wife (nee Philippine Schultheis), two daughters Lena and Elsie, and one son Raymond. He is also survived by his father, Fred Hesterberg, Sr., four brothers, Henry, August, Herman and William, and two sisters, Mr. John Trost and Mrs. William Buschmann.

His remains were laid to rest in the Maeystown cemetery Tuesday afternoon. The funeral services were held in the Maeystown church, Rev. Paul Schulz officiating. A large number of sorrowing relative and friends attended the last sad rites.

Mt. Hesterberg was a good, honest hard-working farmer, and was highly respected by his neighbors and friends. In his death his wife loses a good husband and his children a kind and loving gather. The bereaved relatives have the sincere sympathy of all in their deep affliction.
